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# From the President's Desk

Hi all,

Feeling a chill in the air? Maybe you've noticed the first dustings on the summit? So it's sending season for the unfinished summer rock projects and time to run the file over the crampons you dumped in the bottom of the wardrobe after slush summit!

The instruction team will be gearing up for the snow craft 1 and 2 courses this month and will release details on the club face book page when finalised. For snow craft 1 it will be a case of first in first served. So keep an eye out for confirmation of dates and contact the Club Captain if you start getting nervous. Spaces usually fill up rapidly.

We will be running a slightly different system for snow craft 2 this year, where we'll be taking expressions of interest and asking for applicants to demonstrate that you have progressed since snow craft 1. We're not trying to be elitist but after a minor injury last year to a participant that probably could have done with a bit more experience in the white stuff before taking the course, we need to be sure that people can manage. Nothing too heavy, but we will expect applicants to have progressed on the slopes in your own time since snow craft 1; to have all your basic rope work learnt from the past climbing season; good confidence on moderately steep snow and ice; and your own (properly fitted) crampons, boots and axe. So work up a resume and talk to the instruction team about the course ASAP.

This should get out to the members in time to put out a final notice that the rock instruction/ social climbing weekend at Kawakawa Bay, near Kinloch is **all go**. One of NZs best rock climbing venues with plenty of range for any level of climber. Not to mention a pretty lush bush walk or mountain bike ride in as well. Again, contact Club Captain for further details and car pooling options.

Sophie Tucker has stepped down as trips organizer this year and has handed that role over to Ange Hampton. Ange is working up trip dates for the coming season, including the Tongariro/ Ruapehu trip now so please contact Ange at committee4@outlook.com for any Club trip related queries.

#### Ciud Irips

Our club trips aim to give you the opportunity to practice your alpine & mountaineering skills, get to know Mt Taranaki (and in some cases other awesome NZ mountains), meet other likeminded people and have some laughs!

It is important to note that our club trips are not instruction courses or formal guided events. Our Trip Leads are experienced club members who kindly volunteer their time to share a route they know reasonably well and meet the above trip aims. Each trip participant is expected to be self-sufficient on the mountain, have the skills to undertake the trip, know the gear to bring and, participate under their own risk and responsibility.

Our trips are of course also weather/conditions dependent. Where possible we try to have a reserve date in case weather changes things. We do not charge for our trips although everyone pays for their own gear, equipment, transport, fuel, food, and in some cases accommodation. If we stay anywhere other than Tahurangi Lodge we'll suggest a preferred option as it's always great if everyone stays at the same place.

Special note for winter trips in snow/ice conditions. These trips are for club members who have completed at least Snow Craft 1 (or equivalent). If you need to hire equipment please do so in advance via TAC Gears Officer (contact details at end of this HiTAC and on our website).

#### Hi Trampers

A message from Jared Coombes, DOC Taranaki:

I need the eyes and ears of everyone to help us get on top of what goats are left on the Mountain. We are now at the point where hunters are really struggling to find them. We're confident in saying there's less than 100 goats left, with those being predominately on the Pouakais. If anyone sees, hears or smells a goat within or near the National Park, or know of someone that has, Droughty or myself would like to know immediately so we can respond. This includes weekends and public holidays. This is especially important for VC staff, hut wardens, and the ranger on standby.

If a goat or sign of a goat has been observed, ideally we would get the following information:

a GPS location (or a really good location description)

type of observation i.e. goats seen/heard/smelt, goat prints seen.

If the reported observation is of goat poo seen, a photo would be handy. Quite common to mistake hare poo for goat poo, especially in the tussock or low scrub.

number of goats

colour of the goat/s.

If the information is second hand, a contact number for the original observer would be really helpful too.

We will use muzzled dogs to respond to any sightings of goats from that point until roughly February 2020 when we will start the final push to eradication.

Overnight fees are \$45 for non-members. Members free. Anyone who stays at Tahurangi Lodge must write in the overnight book upstairs by the fridge;

- 1. Their surname and initials.
- 2. Say TAC or non-member.

Bookings by non-members or members taking a group of 5+ people should be made with the Lodge Booking Officer, or by booking online via the Club's website. The lodge subcommittee looks after all maintenance. Contact the Lodge committee if you want to help, have ideas for improvements, or have found something wrong. If you find you can't get into the Lodge because of an eKey failure or you have locked yourself out etc., phone either the Club President, or the Lodge Booking Officer. Contact info on Web page. They may be able to help by supplying the current access code.

## **GEAR HIRE**

TAC Equipment Officer:

The following equipment is available for hire by TAC Club Members:

Ice axes, ice hammers, helmets, harness (incl. karabiners, etc.). Each item costs \$5/day or a maximum of \$10/day for 2 or more items per person. Return the gear promptly after use and you only pay for the days you actually used it. Return it late and risk paying for the complete period; your choice. A PLB (Personal Locator Beacon) is also available for hire and great for back country tramping or alpine climbing. We also have (new) 6mm Prussic Cord for sale to club members at \$2 per meter. Contact the Equipment Officer AT LEAST 2 days in advance to ensure availability.

#### **EVENTS PROGRAMME**

Club nights, trips, instruction and social events are all important functions of the Club's Activities – they need both support from participants as well as volunteers to lead them. If you have suggestions for club nights contact the Club Captain, or would like to volunteer to lead a trip contact the Trips co-ordinator.
