Andy Harris Scholarship

The Andy Harris Scholarship is offered to Taranaki mountaineers who wish to further their mountaineering training. It covers the course fees to attend a mountaineering course in the Southern Alps hosted by Adventure Consultants or Alpine Guides Aoraki Mount Cook. The Taranaki Alpine Club covers the costs of travel to/from the course start/finish location. Over the last two decades a number of TAC climbers have been awarded the scholarship. TAC members who which to apply for the scholarship can do so in writing to the TAC executive committee. If the committee approves, a recommendation is made by the TAC committee to the scholarship trustees for their consideration.



Andy Harris lost his life on Everest in 1996 whilst attempting to save the lives of Rob Hall and Andy Hanson who were stranded near the top of the mountain, late in the day, with bad weather approaching. On that same day, Andy had summited Everest along with Anatoli Boukreev and Jon Krakauer. Harris was one of the guides for the Adventure Consultants' 1996 Everest expedition, led by Rob Hall.

Andy originated from New Plymouth and attended Francis Douglas Memorial College. He learnt his mountaineering on Mt Taranaki, and later worked as a ski guide and mountain guide in the Southern Alps. Andy also worked as a field leader for the New Zealand Antarctic Research Program in the late 80's and early 90's.

In recognition of his remarkable contributions, the New Zealand Geographic Board bestowed the honour of naming a peak in Victoria Land, Antarctica after Andy Harris. This distinguished summit, known as Harris Peak, resides amidst the notable Mount Hall and Ball Peak, names that bear significance to Harris's legacy. In 1999, Harris was awarded the New Zealand Bravery Star, a testament to his unwavering bravery and selflessness.


