Your committee has had a busy month dealing with the usual club business and amongst the correspondence we received an email advising us that the Te Pire Whakatupua mō Te Kāhui Tupua/Taranaki Maunga Collective Redress Bill had had its first reading and was now before the Māori Affairs Select Committee for consideration and submissions were open.

We had a timeframe of about 2 weeks to read the document, discuss and put together a draft submission for you the members to be aware of, so we could include any feedback in our final submission.

I wish to extend my gratitude to the committee who took the additional time and shared their knowledge, this has been extremely valuable - thank you!

Last HiTAC I put a call out for anyone interested in being involved in a sub-group working on the 100th jubilee celebration book (or something similar), Andrew Jordan is willing to drive the project. He has advised that Finn is willing to be involved and Gail is also.

In reality, the period to reflect upon will be the last 25 years – as a book was printed for the 75th jubilee. Things that could be mentioned are things like the renovation downstairs, the power cable upgrade, trips with photos included etc etc....

A Sunday stroll to a plane wreck and waterfall


A few TAC members (Clarissa, Sheryl, Phil and I) recently visited the infamous plane wreck located on the mountain. After meeting at Mangorei Road car park and finding the correct side trail off the Mangorei Track, the crew enjoyed a wander through the bush, which included a few stream/tributary crossings, some sliding on damp rocks and mossy logs, and a couple of fun sections with tree fall and steep terrain to navigate. We were often thankful for roots and vines providing helpful handholds.


After just over an hour, we found the site. The WWII aircraft crashed into the side of the mountain in 1942, and was not found for over 30 years, when a goat hunter happened upon it. It is well worth a visit, as there are still some impressively intact pieces to marvel at.

After this, a short stroll took us to a hidden gem of a waterfall. Clarissa lowered herself down what looked like a muddy vertical drop, and then managed to find a much easier route for the rest of us to walk down and glimpse at the tiered falls flowing into a crystal-clear pool, perfectly framed by foliage. Undeterred by the old underpants found nearby, we all mentally bookmarked the spot for a summer swim and picnic.

We decided it was a bit too slippery underfoot to tackle the scrambly bush-bash up to the tarns, but resolved to come back in the drier months to do the round trip. It was a great way to spend a Sunday morning; many thanks to the gang for helping me tick off a Taranaki must-do list walk!



TAC's lodge sleeps 24, has electric heating and cooking, cutlery, pots and pans, etc. Just like home. Members can request an eKey by completing the application available from the Club's website.

Overnight fee is \$55 for non-members. Members free. Anyone who stays at Tahurangi Lodge must write in the overnight book upstairs by the fridge;

- 1. Their surname and initials.

Bookings by non-members or members taking a group of 5+ people should be made with the Lodge Booking Officer, or by booking online via the Club's website. The lodge subcommittee looks after all maintenance and can be contacted for help, feedback or suggestions. 
