I'm still new to this role so working through the processes this involves. Compiling a trips calendar is certainly a task. Ideas for trips come from YOU, our TAC members. Your individual suggestions are very much appreciated. So, if you have taken a trip and thought it would be great to share with other TAC members let me know.

Leaders are required for trips to go ahead; if you would like to step into this role with a trip that fits your comfort zone, let me know. Sharing your knowledge and skills is valuable for the growth of TAC. Personal involvement is what keeps the club ticking over. Buddy walks;

Buddy walks are provided through the club for those wanting to gain confidence and skill with the support of experienced club members. These walks are not considered instruction courses but more of an informal, small group "buddy system" walk to enable club members to share knowledge and provide guidance for newer members as they develop their winter skills, safety and decision making

Participants are expected to have enough experience (ie Snow craft 1 or equivalent) and are responsible for their own fitness and acquiring of own gear. (this can be done through our gear hire system)

The plan is to run  $\frac{1}{2}$  day buddy walks fortnightly from the 19th of July

Club Nights are held on the first Thursday of each month, usually at 7:30pm at Fitzroy Golf Club, 3 Record Street, unless otherwise advertised.



## **Trip & Course Reports**

### Plane wreck/tarns...and a ferret 24/5/25

This was Rachel's first trip as trip coordinator, and despite not being able to make the event herself, she couldn't have done a better job, from arranging our very capable trip lead, Clarissa, enticing a good number of participants (ten altogether), and important details like great weather - blue sky (mostly).

Advertised as a trip to the plane wreck-I have learned that our Mounga is a veritable junkyard and there are actually four plane wrecks up there, and also the tarns, there were many other "side trips" segwayed into our day.

Phil Whitwell had kindly negotiated a 7:20 start from our trip lead (better to wait for the sun to get up.)

We were all abuzz, setting our Garmin watches, Strava and Topo GPS apps, and heading off the Pouakai track for an epic adventure.

A short way up the main track we peeled off to the left, where the terrain became more interesting - lots of steeply undulating track, with the occasional stream to cross or large fallen tree to negotiate.

After about 90 minutes, we came to the plane wreck - lots of unrecognisable bits of old metal smeared over the hillside. This particular wreck was and Airspeed Oxford, crashed 23 Oct 1942 but was not located till 1974.

After this small detour, we returned to the track, taking another small but steeply downhill detour further up to Mangorei waterfall. Well worth checking out although no one was up for a swim today.

We clawed our way uphill back to the main track - the main track being marked by blue triangles, with bits of red string to indicate a side trip.

The terrain flattened out to a more gradual ascent, then started to steepen again. On one of these steep sections, there was a trap, containing fresh kill. Sheryl got in there with her bare hands and hauled out her prize, a fresh, fluffy female ferret. She reset the trap (while we watched with bated breath, hoping that we would not need any first aid skills for partially amputated fingers).

With the furry friend bundled into a bread bag (yet another use for used plastic), we were off again.

The track started to steepen, with small (rather faded) looking ropes in a couple of places to aid the ascent. Eventually, we broke out above the bush line, heading through the tussock to creep up behind the dozens of people already waiting by the tarns for the mountain to make an appearance for that Instagram-worthy picture.

We headed along the main track to Pouakai hut, and on the rocky part above the hut, Phil pointed out some old rock graffiti from the 1960s. (Not his work.)

We had our lunch at the new, partially completed Pouakai hut...watch this space. Then picked up the "tourist trail" back down, with Phil pointing out some more graffiti, this time from 1880, and further down, a short trail that led to the site where the old Mangorei hut had once stood.

We had also noticed some random rectangular cage-like structures on the trackside, and these, we learned from Phil, protect a type of parasitic flowering plant called Dactylanthus - on which the native bats feed.

From there, we continued down the wooden steps, reaching the carpark in the early afternoon - having walked for around five hours, buzzing from our adventure.

Thank you to Rachel for arranging this, to Clarissa for her excellent leading, Phil for his extensive knowledge and everyone on the trip who kept up interesting conversations on all manner of things including lots of inspiration for future adventures. Claire
